
Members Safety Rules

- Access to each unit to be via the designated access & egress points.
- Access for members is to be restricted to those areas directly connected with the club and associated areas only.
- The club rules may change from time to time depending on activities or events or incidents. Please make sure you understand the changes.
- Anyone found not complying with the club rules will be subject to the clubs disciplinary procedures.
- Fire emergency procedures are: RAISE THE ALARM AND CALL THE EMERGENCY SERVICES
- Assembly point is by the main gate. In the event of an emergency, members are required to attend there and wait for the emergency services.
- Make your way to the assembly point, all persons on site to be familiar with emergency procedures and the location of fire points.
- For yours and others protection, permits must be sought before any hazardous work is carried out, see the committee for more information & instructions.
- When carrying out tasks or activities around the yard and site, Full PPE must be worn including Gloves, Safety Glasses, Overalls, Hearing Protection, FFP3 Masks as necessary and relevant to the task / activity being carried out. All members can request advice from the club Health & Safety Advisor. Members are advised to also wear the correct PPE when working around their boats and allocated plots etc.
- When working in a workplace capacity, high visibility clothing shall be worn at all times whilst working within the work area and on our club grounds.
- Induction register must be signed as agreement that you understand the safety requirements, SSOW, safety assessments, work area and club rules.
- Make sure you keep all the areas clean and tidy toilets or facilities at any time, they are for your benefit.
- Nearest hospital or medical facility is as instructed on the Route to Hospital Document.
- No smoking anywhere near the fuel area and only in designated areas.
- When working in a workplace capacity on club grounds, we request that ankle high laced boots with steel toe cap and mid sole are worn whilst working activities are being carried out. Members are advised to also wear the correct PPE when working around their boats and allocated plots etc.
- Please read all information available on the notice board. Follow instructions at all times.
- Please take NOTE of first aid station and your first aider details, report all incidents and injuries, however trivial, to the committee and enter details in the accident book. Please contact the Health & Safety Advisor to advise of the incident also.
- Protection measures must be supplied at all times to protect the working areas and cordon off any work area from unauthorised persons, public or pedestrians and place signage up to advise of the dangers.
- Qualifications, training and certificates for operators must be filled in and recorded and include cards / certificates, and recorded within the Safety Control Management System (SCMS).
- Risk & COSHH assessments and Safe Systems of Works must be understood and agreed by all members and contractors before carrying out any works on the club grounds.
- Vehicles must be parked in the appropriate car park only (unless advised elsewhere) Park only in designated areas - do not block access roads/emergency areas.
- Always reverse park to help prevent potential accidents.
- Vehicles should keep to the speed limit of 10 mph at all times.
